
that truly matter. If you have a story of how VRUMC has touched your life, or the importance of stewardship and are willing to share your story, let the church office know.

## Submit a Recipe for the Vision

## **Cooking for Health: Quinoa & Vegetable Stir-Fry**

Ingredients:

- 1 cup quinoa
- 1/4 cup low-sodium soy
- sauce or tamari (gluten-free)
- 2 Tbs honey or maple syrup
- 1 tsp grated fresh ginger
- 1/2 tsp red pepper flakes
- 1. Cook 1 Cup quinoa according to package.
- 2. In a small bowl, whisk together the soy sauce (or tamari), honey (or maple syrup), grated ginger, and red pepper flakes to make the stirfry sauce. Adjust the sweetness and spiciness to your liking.

3. Heat the oil in a large skillet or wok over medium-high heat. Add the diced onion sauté for 2-3 minutes until they become fragrant and slightly translucent.

4. Add the sliced bell pepper, carrot, broccoli florets, snap/snow peas, and mushrooms to the skillet. Stir-fry the vegetables for 5-7 minutes or until they are tender-crisp and slightly caramelized.

5. Add the garlic, cook until it is fragrant.

- 2 Tbs olive or avocado oil
- 1 small onion, diced
- 1 bell pepper, thinly sliced
- 1 carrot, thinly sliced

•

- 1 cup broccoli florets
- 1 cup snap peas or snow peas, trimmed
- 1 cup sliced mushrooms
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Chopped fresh cilantro or green onions for garnish (optional)

Pour the stir-fry sauce over the cooked vegetables and stir well to coat all the vegetables evenly. Cook for an additional 1-2 minutes to heat the sauce thoroughly.
Add the cooked quinoa to the skillet and toss everything together. Cook for another 2-3 minutes, allowing the quinoa to absorb the flavors and heat through. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

8. Remove from heat and garnish with chopped fresh cilantro or green onions if desired.

Serve your healthy quinoa and vegetable stir-fry hot and enjoy a nutritious meal to kick off the New Year! Pastor Ann

## **Donations Needed for ABC Program**

Mesa, AZ – MESA RESIDENTS CAN HELP their community during the holiday season and yearround through the ABC: A Better Community utility donation program. This City of Mesa initiative provides shelter, meals, and other essential services to Mesa children, families, and seniors facing economic challenges. Donating to ABC is easy. City of Mesa utility customers can contribute by automatically donating money with their monthly utility bill payments. People can also round up the dollar on your utility bill or contribute a one-time amount.

For the 23/24 fiscal year, the City has allocated ABC grant money to five non-profit agencies:

- Boys & Girls Club of the Valley provides out of school time mentoring, academic success, daily snacks and meals to Mesa community members
- Copa Health provides career counseling/ assessment, resume building, employment coaching and creates service plans and goals to Mesa community members in need
- Catholic Charities Community Services provides outreach services, counseling, shelter bed nights and case management/support groups to Mesa community members who are struggling
- Homeless Youth Connection provides case management services, assistance with graduating from high school, safe and stable housing to Mesa Youth who are homeless
- Paz des Cristo helps provide meals, food, clothing, showers, and other services to Mesa



community members struggling with hunger, poverty, and homelessness

During the past year, ABC donations helped Mesa non-profit organizations provide the following services:

- Feed: 127,725 residents with meals
- Clothe: clean clothes and a hot shower to get a fresh start

- Empower: help people find jobs and remove barriers to get ahead

The ABC: A Better Community program assisted 127,725 Mesa residents during the 2022-2023 fiscal year.

**EARTHDAY.ORG ANNOUNCES OFFICIAL 2024 EARTH DAY THEME** EARTHDAY.ORG, the global organizer of Earth Day, has announced the global theme for Earth Day 2024: *Planet vs. Plastics*.

*Planet vs. Plastics* unites students, parents, businesses, governments, churches, unions, individuals, and NGOs in an unwavering commitment to call for the end of plastics for the sake of human and planetary health, demanding a 60% reduction in the production of plastics by 2040 and an ultimate goal of building a plastic-free future for generations to come.

To achieve a 60% reduction by 2040,

EARTHDAY.ORG's goals are: (1) promoting widespread public awareness of the damage done by plastic to human, animal, and all biodiversity's health and demanding more research be conducted on its health implications, including the release of any and all information regarding its effects to the public; (2) rapidly phasing out all single use plastics by 2030 and achieving this phase out commitment in the United Nations Treaty on Plastic Pollution in 2024; (3) demanding policies ending the scourge of fast fashion and the vast amount of plastic it produces and uses; and (4) investing in innovative technologies and materials to build a plastic-free world.

"The word environment means what surrounds you. Now plastics do more than surround us; we have become the product itself- it flows through our blood stream, adheres to our internal organs, and carries with it heavy metals known to cause cancer and disease. Now this once-thought amazing and useful product has become something else, and our health and that of all other living creatures hangs in the balance," said Kathleen Rogers, President of EARTHDAY.ORG. "The *Planet vs. Plastics* campaign is a call to arms, a demand that we act now to end the scourge of plastics and safeguard the health of every living being upon our planet."


